GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS



1. Chevening Scholarship

Fully-funded scholarships to undertake select master's course at any UK university.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a Chevening Scholarship you must:

- Be a citizen of a Chevening-eligible country or territory.
- Return to your country of citizenship for a minimum of two years after your award has ended.
- Have completed all components of an undergraduate degree that will enable you to gain entry onto a postgraduate programme at a UK university by the time you submit your application. This is typically equivalent to an upper second-class 2:1 honours degree in the UK.
- Have at least two years of work experience.
- Apply to three different eligible UK university courses and have received an unconditional offer from one of these choices by 16 July 2020.
- Meet the Chevening English language requirement by 16 July 2020.

2. The Gates Cambridge Scholarship Programme

The scholarship was established in October 2000 by a donation of US\$210m from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation to the University of Cambridge; this is the largest ever single donation to a UK university. For 2020 entry, Gates Cambridge will offer 80 full-cost scholarships to outstanding applicants from countries outside the UK to pursue a full-time postgraduate degree in any subject available at the University of Cambridge.

Eligibility

- outstanding intellectual ability
- reasons for choice of course
- a commitment to improving the lives of others
- leadership potential
- Note that this scholarship will be taken up at the University of Cambridge

3. Excellence Fellowships for Master's Study in Switzerland

École Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL) offers a limited number of fellowships at master's level to students with outstanding academic records. Anyone applying to an EPFL master's program is eligible. The selection of candidates and the granting of the fellowships is done based on the evaluation of the academic records of the candidates.

Eligibility

- Anyone applying to an EPFL master's program is eligible. The EPFL grants a limited number of fellowships to the most deserving candidates based solely on their academic records.
- Cumulating this fellowship with other substantial scholarships is not possible. Candidates are required to declare all the scholarships they receive during their master's.

4. The Oxford and Cambridge Club (OCC) Nigeria Cambridge Scholarship

Eligibility

This scholarship covers full tuition and stipend for one student pursuing a masters degree at the University of Cambridge. Only students from Nigeria are eligible.

5. The Karolinska Institutet Global Master's Scholarships

Karolinska Institutet offers a handful of tuition fee scholarships to excellent students who have been admitted to one of their Global Master's Programmes starting each Autumn semester. The amount of scholarships varies from year to year, but there are maximum of 10 scholarships per year, spread to all the Global Master's Programmes.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the KI Global Master's Scholarship you must:

- have applied to one of Karolinska Institutet's Global Master's Programmes starting 2019
- be a tuition fee paying student (from outside the EU/EEA)
- have paid the application fee
- fulfil the entry and documentation requirements for the programme you have applied for
- Only first year students are eligible to apply.

6. Global Excellence Scholarships- University College Dublin

Students who have an Offer (or Conditional Offer) to an eligible UCD programme can now apply for the Prestigious Global Excellence Scholarship. The Global Excellence Scholarship provides students

with a fee scholarship to the value of 100% or 50% of their annual tuition fees. This is a highly competitive scholarship with a limited number available per region.

Eligibility

1. Undergraduate: Successful applicants will be residents of an African country at the time of application.

2. Graduate Taught: Successful applicants will be residents and citizens of an African country at the time of application. Applicants may reside in a different country to the country of their citizenship, provided that both countries are African.

*The following countries are not considered for the African Global Excellence Scholarship but will instead be considered for the Middle East and North Africa Global Excellence Scholarship: • Algeria • Egypt • Libya • Morocco • Tunisia • Sudan

Please consult the Global Excellence Scholarship document for the Middle East and North Africa for further information if you are applying from any of these countries.

3. Applicants must be classified as non-EU for tuition fee and application purposes.

7. Masters Scholarships to study at the University of Laval

The purpose of this program is to promote academic excellence by offering scholarships to foreign students who are citizens of an African or European country (other than France and French speaking Belgian students¹) and are admitted to a master's program at Université Laval.

This scholarship of \$7,000 per year is renewable once, subject to compliance with the faculty's criteria of excellence and upon the research director's recommendation and faculty approval.

Eligibility

- The Registrar's Office considers the average available when the application is reviewed.
- Achieve a score of 14/20 or better or the equivalent of a "mention bien" on the diploma required for admission.
- Scholarships are awarded to candidates admitted to a master's program

8. Swedish Institute Scholarships for Global Professionals (SISGP)

Do you have ambition, leadership experience and a strong professional background? You could study for a master's degree in Sweden on a fully-funded Swedish Institute scholarship.

Eligibility

- Work experience

You must have minimum of 3,000 hours of demonstrated employment.

- Leadership experience

You must have demonstrated leadership experience from your current or previous employment.

- Country of citizenship

You must be a citizen of a country that is eligible for the scholarship programme (In Africa, citizens from these countries can apply Cameroon; Egypt; Ethiopia; Gambia; Ghana; Kenya; Liberia; Malawi; Morocco; Nigeria; Rwanda; Sudan; Tanzania; Tunisia; Uganda; Zambia; Zimbabwe.)

- Master's programmes

The master's studies must be eligible for SI scholarships.

- University admissions

You must be liable to pay tuition fees to Swedish universities, have followed the steps of university admission, and be admitted to one of the eligible master's programmes.

9. Chancellor's International Scholarship to study at Warwick Doctoral College

For 2020/21 entry there will be 30 Chancellor's International Scholarships available to be awarded to the most outstanding international PhD applicants. Awards made for entry in Autumn 2020 will include both of the following:

- The full payment of overseas tuition fees (worth up to £24,010)
- A maintenance stipend in line with UKRI rates (provisional £15,239 for full time award holders in 2020/21, expected to be confirmed February 2020)
- Length of funding: 3.5 years, unless you are already in your first year of study when you apply then the length of funding will be reduced accordingly.

Eligibility

- Applicants for a Chancellor's International Scholarship must also be applying for a PhD at the University of Warwick;
- Students currently enrolled on a PhD or MPhil/PhD at the University of Warwick may apply in their first year of registration only;
- Applicants must expect to be 'overseas' students for fees purposes, but there is no other nationality criteria;
- Applicants may be from any discipline at Warwick.
- Scholarships cannot be deferred to the next academic year.

10. University of Oulu International Scholarships

The University of Oulu International Scholarship Scheme provides scholarships to academically talented international students studying for a Master's degree in the University of Oulu two-year International Master's programmes or five -year Intercultural Teacher Education programme. The scholarships will be granted in the form of a tuition fee waiver covering 50% or 75% of the full tuition fee. Applicants can apply for the tuition scholarship as part of the admissions process. University of Oulu Scholarships do not cover living costs.

Eligibility

- Applicants are eligible to apply for a University of Oulu Scholarship, if they meet the admissions criteria and are liable to pay the tuition fee. University of Oulu Scholarship can be received only once. The scholarship application will be processed in the selection procedure only if the applicant meets the admissions criteria.
- There is no separate application system for the International Scholarship. Applications for the International Scholarship are submitted together with the application for the preferred study option in the Studyinfo portal.
- Admissions and scholarships decisions will be taken at the same time. Those students successful in obtaining an International Scholarship will be notified at the same time as their offer of admission to their International study programme is confirmed. The selection criteria for the University of Oulu Scholarship are based on previous academic performance and academic potential.

11. Global Minds Doctoral Scholarships Program at KU Leuven

As one of its contributions to development cooperation, every academic year KU Leuven selects exceptional students from developing countries as scholarship candidates to obtain their PhD from the largest university of Belgium. The Global Minds Programme is managed by IRO, the university's Interfaculty Council for Development Cooperation.

The aim is to give students the opportunity to conduct PhD research in a 'sandwich' system, which means that maximum 50% of the research takes place at KU Leuven and 50% at the home institution of the scholar, supported by a local co-promoter. The PhD degree is awarded by KU Leuven.

Eligibility

- The scholarships are offered to excellent proposals that deal with a development-relevant research topic, preferably linked to the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Having obtained their doctoral degree from KU Leuven, the PhD holders are expected to utilise their expertise at the university in their home country.

12. Rotary International's Fully Funded Peace Fellowships

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully-funded fellowships for dedicated leaders from around the world to study at one of their peace centers. Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops the capacity of peace and development professionals or practitioners to become experienced and effective catalysts for peace. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

Eligibility

The Rotary Peace Fellowship is designed for leaders with work experience in peace and development. Fellows are committed to the community and international service and the pursuit of peace. Each year, The Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 80 for certificate studies at premier universities

13. Orange Knowledge Programme to Study in Holland

The Orange Knowledge Programme aims to contribute to a society's sustainable and inclusive development. Its scholarships are typically open to mid-career professionals in specific countries.

Eligibility

Citizens from the following countries are eligible: Afghanistan Albania Armenia Bangladesh Benin Bhutan Bolivia Burkina Faso Burundi Cambodia Colombia Congo (DRC) Cuba Egypt Ethiopia Georgia Ghana Guatemala Guinea Indonesia Jordan Kenya Lebanon Liberia Mali Mozambique Myanmar Nepal Nicaragua Niger Nigeria North Macedonia Pakistan Palestinian Territories Peru Philippines Rwanda Senegal Sierra Leone Somalia South Africa South Sudan Sri Lanka Sudan Suriname Tanzania Thailand Tunisia Uganda Vietnam Yemen Zambia Zimbabwe

14. Siemens China Scholarship to study at Tsinghua University

The Siemens China Scholarship at Tsinghua University is a full scholarship offered by Siemens Ltd., China to support outstanding international students to pursue Ph.D. degrees in Tsinghua University. The Scholarship recipients will cooperate with Siemens in 8 fields, such as Artificial Intelligence, Future of Automation, Autonomous Robotics, etc. to conduct research in the Ph.D. stage. Through the study and practice in the forefront of industrial technology development, Scholarship recipients will lay the foundation for the growth of innovative talents in the industry.

Eligibility

Applicants for the Scholarship should meet all the following requirements:

- Meet the requirements of admission for international graduate students (detailed information refer to the Admission to Graduate Programs of Tsinghua University 2020 (For International Students));
- Should apply the department/school in the table 1 (check the link at the end of post);
- Must appreciate Siemens Values, and be willing to work together with Siemens to carry out research work;
- Are not offered other kinds of scholarships for study at Tsinghua University.

15. Fulbright Foreign Student Program (Scholarships to study in the United States)

The Fulbright Foreign Student Program (formerly Fulbright JSD) is a non-degree program funded by the U.S. Department of State in Washington, D.C. and administered by the Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and the Institute of International Education (IIE) in New York. The program is designed primarily to strengthen the capacities of African universities through higher degree training and to develop the potential of their academic staff. It is targeted at young and exceptionally promising faculty members who wish to conduct their doctoral research in the United States. Applicants must be at least two years into their doctoral program in any discipline at a Nigerian university or research institute at the time of application.

Eligibility

- Applicants must be citizens or nationals of Nigeria, or permanent residents holding a valid passport issued by the Nigerian government.
- Applicants must be doctoral students and have the endorsement of their home institution.
- Applicants must be at least two years into their doctoral program in any discipline.
- Applicants must have an outstanding academic record and a high level of English proficiency.
- Applicants must meet a minimum score of 100 on the internet-based TOEFL test.

- The Fulbright Foreign Student Program is typically open to applicants in all disciplines. However, proposals for clinical medical research involving patient contact cannot be approved under the Fulbright Program.
- Applicants must have high motivation and a serious commitment to completing the program as scheduled and to returning home.
- Only applicants with strong proposals, outlining their research objectives, methodology, time-frame, and justification for conducting the research in the U.S. will be short-listed for interviews.
- Preference will be given to applicants who have not studied in the U.S.

16. The Matsumae International Foundation Research Fellowship Program

The Matsumae International Foundation (MIF) is a non-governmental organization whose fund is solely based on donations from many Japanese people who have responded with goodwill to Dr. Shigeyoshi Mataumae's call. If you meet all of the following eligibility requirements, you are invited to submit the required application documents.

Eligibility

- Applicants must obtain a Letter of Invitation from host institutions in Japan.
- Applicants must hold a PH.D. (Doctorate) degree, or be recognized by MIF as possessing equivalent academic
- Applicants must be at the age of 49 years old or younger at the time when documents are submitted.
- Applicants must have sufficient abilities in the English or Japanese languages.
- Applicants should not have past or current experiences of staying in Japan. (Except for short-term stay. e.g. sightseeing, conferences)
- Applicants should be in employment in their home countries, and must return to their countries upon completion of their MIF fellowship tenure.

17. IOE-ISH Centenary Taught Master's Scholarships

International Students House (ISH) and the UCL Institute of Education (IOE) offer the following scholarships: International Students House Centenary Scholarship, and the Mary Trevelyan Centenary Scholarship (in honour of the founder of ISH).

ISH provides accommodation for a year, while the IOE covers tuition fees. Please note that these scholarships do not cover subsistence in London, travel or any other expenses. The scholarships are tenable for one academic year, subject to satisfactory progress.

Eligibility

Candidates should:

- be citizens and residents of a low- or middle-income country with a GNI not higher than \$8000 per capita (as per the World Bank GNI per capita classification tables)
- have an unconditional offer to study a full-time master's degree in London at the UCL Institute of Education (September / October 2020 start)
- not have studied or lived in the UK before.

18. WMG Excellence Scholarships

WMG scholarships are merit-based awards, available on a competitive basis. Applications will be judged on past academic achievement, professional experience, reasons for study, and your vision for the future. WMG Excellence Scholarships are awarded on a % discount of the tuition fees, with awards ranging from 10% to 50% tuition fee discount.

Eligibility

- Applicants must hold an offer to study on a WMG full-time MSc course starting October 2020.
- Applicants should have an excellent academic track-record and/or strong professional profile in order to qualify.
- For conditional offer-holders, scholarship awards will also be conditional on achieving the awardee's final predicted grade.
- WMG Excellence Scholarships are for self-funded students only. NB: students with partial bursaries on scholarship-loan schemes or partially funded by an external organisation may also be considered. Awardees should inform the scholarship committee if they are in receipt of another scholarship or are later awarded other funding.
- WMG Excellence Scholarships are awarded for study on UK full-time MSc programmes only.
- WMG Excellence Scholarships are paid towards tuition fees only and cannot be paid in cash or towards accommodation or maintenance costs.
- WMG will award WMG Excellence Scholarships across all WMG full-time MSc programmes to optimise nationality and gender diversity.

19. Australia Awards John Allwright Fellowship

Applicants must be working with an Australian Centre for International Agriculture Research (ACIAR) project in a current partner developing country. Applicants must be citizens of the country in which they are working.

Eligibility

To be eligible for selection, a candidate must:

- at the time of applying, hold qualifications that would be assessed to be equivalent to at least an Australian bachelor's degree in a discipline that is relevant to the proposed area of postgraduate study;
- be a scientist or economist from the developing country partner, who is actively involved in a collaborative research project supported by ACIAR at the time of application (in some cases, ACIAR will consider supporting researchers from "advanced pipeline" projects, i.e. in cases where a full project proposal has been approved by ACIAR);
- be jointly supported in the application by the Australian and partner country Project Leaders;
- obtain approval from the employing institution who must agree to the absence of the candidate should he/she receive a Fellowship for the period involved in obtaining the postgraduate qualification;
- and demonstrate that he/she is employed on a permanent rather than short-term contract basis.

20. Africa International PGR Scholarships at King's College London

Typically open to residents of the following countries Zimbabwe, Zambia, Uganda, Tunisia, Togo, Tanzania, Sudan, South Africa, Somalia, Sierra Leone, Seychelles, Senegal, Sao Tome and Principe, Rwanda, Nigeria, Niger, Namibia, Mozambique, Morocco, Mauritius, Mauritania, Mali, Malawi, Madagascar, Libya, Liberia, Lesotho, Kenya, Guinea-Bissau, Guinea, Ghana, Gambia, Gabon, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Equatorial Guinea, Egypt, Djibouti, Cote d'Ivoire, Congo, Republic of, Congo, Democratic People's Republic, Comoros, Chad, Central African Republic, Cap Verde, Cameroon, Burundi, Burkina Faso, Botswana, Benin, Angola, Algeria

Eligibility

Candidates must:

- Be African nationals and permanently resident in the relevant country
- Be liable for tuition fees at the higher international/overseas rate
- Plan to commence a full-time MPhil/PhD programme at King's College London in the 2020-21 academic year (from October 2020 and by no later than July 2021)

- Plan to conduct research that is relevant to Africa, at the intersection of two or more of the given themes or disciplines, - Conflict, Peace and Security, Global Health, Development and Digital Technology .
- Hold an admissions offer for an MPhil/PhD programme at King's by 1 April 2020

21. Professor de Winter Scholarship at the University of Twente (UT)

Professor de Winter and Mrs. de Winter were highly involved in UT programmes and with 'their' students. Their heirs continue to be involved in their honour by awarding a scholarship of € 7,500 to an excellent female student.

Eligibility

You cannot apply for a Professor de Winter scholarship yourself. You need to be nominated by your faculty, after you have applied for the University of Twente Scholarship (UTS)

22. University of Twente Scholarship (UTS)

The University Twente Scholarship (UTS) is a scholarship for excellent students from both EU/EEA as well as non-EU/EEA countries, applying for a graduate programme (MSc) at the University of Twente. Exclusive opportunity to take part in an intake for one of the three honours programmes: Research honours, Design honours, or Change leaders.

Eligibility

- Application for an UT scholarship is a procedure separate from the application for course entry at the University of Twente. Regardless of funding, you will need to gain an admission letter first.
- You have been (provisionally) admitted to one of the qualifying UT Master programmes starting in the academic year 2020/2021 (September). Please note: After completion of your application, it may take up to 8 weeks before you receive the results.
- You must have a student number.
- You have not graduated from a UT (under) graduate programme;
- You comply with the conditions for obtaining an entry visa in the Netherlands (if applicable);
- You comply with the general English language test requirement Academic IELTS 6.5 (or TOEFL iBT of 90) and an additional 6.0 (TOEFL iBT 20) on the subscore of speaking skills
- You are not eligible for a Dutch study loan;
- The University Twente Scholarship is a scholarship for excellent students. Typically, this means that you belong to the best 5 to 10 percent of your class

23. Dalarna University Partial Masters Scholarships

Every year, Dalarna University awards partial scholarships to a number of its new international, fee-paying Master's students who have proven themselves to be outstanding in their educational endeavours.

Amount of Scholarship

The scholarships go directly towards a reduction in your tuition fees and will cover between 10 and 50 percent of your total tuition fees. The amount that you are awarded is automatically deducted in set amounts each semester over the duration of your programme.

24. Commonwealth Shared Scholarship

Commonwealth Shared Scholarships are for candidates from least developed and lower middle income Commonwealth countries, for full-time Master's study on selected courses, jointly supported by UK universities.
